Special Events

After listening to suggestions from PAC members at our last meeting, YCS has decided to implement the following changes to our Special Events:

- Replace the Valentines Dance with a Family Luau. This event will be open to all parent's/guardians and their children. Capped at 150 total people.
- Discontinue offering the Easter Egg Hunt event. No replacement event has yet been implemented.
- For the Carol Sing and Tree Lighting Event YCS plans to implement the following changes:
 - Ask the YHS band to include songs that represent other cultures/religions
 - Offer a "winter wonderland" or other non-Santa photo opportunity in addition to photos with Santa
 - YCS is establishing a Celebrate the Season volunteer work group to help organize and offer other cultural experiences during the winter season.
- Change Mother/Son nerf event to a coed Grown-up & Me nerf event.
- Light Up Yarmouth will continue to be offered with no changes
- Trunk or Treat will continue with no changes
